In the 1930's he was well-known for fancy console models that superficially resembled Scotts, but sold for a fraction of the price. After the war, Hoffman moved into television. In 1953, Cincinnati businessman Spencer W. Cunningham became president of Midwest, making TV's for a year or two before calling it quits.

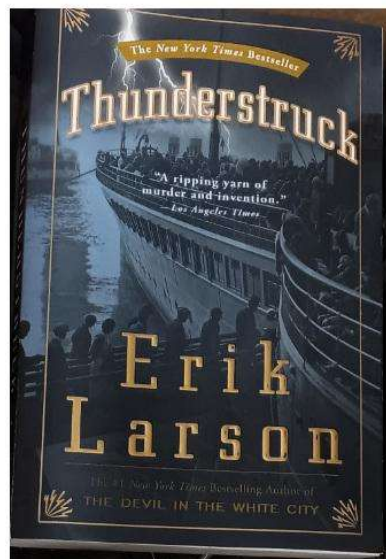

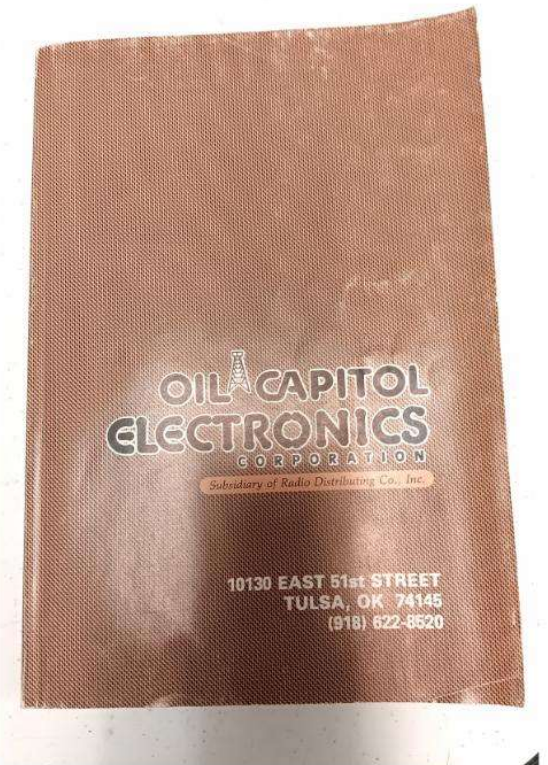

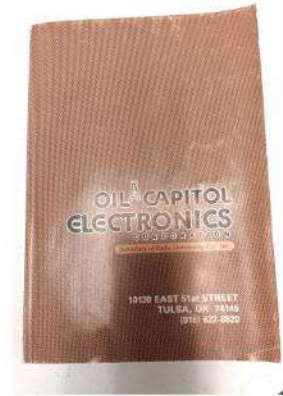
